HISTORY IN BRIEF (1)

1215 : University foundation act
1257 : opening of Collège de Sorbon
Around 1265 : opening of a library in Collège de Sorbon
1'000 books in 1300, 5000 in 1500
bibliotheca parva / bibliotheca communis

1630-1642 : construction of Sorbonne University by Richelieu1770 : opening of the Library of Sorbonne (100'000 volumes), first university library in France

1808 : foundation by Napoleon of the « Université »

HISTORY IN BRIEF (2)

1880-1886 : laws Ferry and Goblet about primary, secondary and higher education

1895-1902 : second construction of Sorbonne by Henri-Paul Nénot a general university for humanities and sciences a fragile Eiffel structure

a small library (200'000 volumes)

1930-1932 : refurbishment of the library construction of 2 towers of stacks (1'000'000 volumes)

HISTORY IN BRIEF (3)


1970-1972 : refurbishment of the library construction of underground stacks (1'000'000 volumes) science collections are moved to Jussieu Universities


1994-2007 : partial restructurations : refurbishment of ancient books reading room (1994) the frescoes of the main reading room are washed (1996) refurbishment of serials reading room (2000) refurbishment of catalogues reading room (2007)






PLANNING THE REFURBISHMENT (2003-2010), 1

Sorbonne is a property of Paris City Council (+/- 100'000 m²)

Security systems on behalf of the Universities Chancellor

August 2003 : security and safety commission

lack of :

- safety systems
- evacuation systems
- protection against fire
- access for disabled people

electric failures

insufficient ventilation

dangerous and deficient plumbing system

The Chancellor is urged to close the Library (September 2003)

PLANNING THE REFURBISHMENT (2)

End of 2003 :

the Chancellor manages to delay the closure the Chancellor is urged to conceive a project of refurbishment in cooperation with Paris City Council

2004-2005 :

project of building new stacks underneath the courtyard

2005 :

the project is abandoned

PLANNING THE REFURBISHMENT (3)

2006-2008 :

a new project of refurbishment is planned :

- security purposes
- restructuration of the reading rooms and the stacks
- loss of 38% of storage
- a new building for stacks in Marne-la-Vallée (CTLes)

March 2008 :

first validation of the new project of refurbishment

April 2009 :

final validation of the project of refurbishment

June 2009 :

« impact survey » about the consequences of the works

PLANNING THE REFURBISHMENT (4)

June 2009 – June 2010 : movings

October 2009 – January, then March 2010 : invitations to tender

Spring 2010 : definition of the contracts

April, 9th 2010 : the library closed in Sorbonne

May, 10th 2010 : the library will open in Sainte-Barbe Library

July, 5th 2010 : the works start...

MOVING (June 2009 – June 2010)

35'000 m of stacks

occupancy in June 2009 = 99,8%

Repartition of the collections :

- Centre technique du livre de l'enseignement supérieur in Marnela-Vallée (32 km from Paris, 17'000 m of stacks)

- Crypt of Notre-Dame du Liban Church (8'000 m of stacks, 500 m from Sainte-Barbe Library)

- Sainte-Barbe Library (12000 m of stacks, 1'000 m in open access, reading rooms)



DURING THE WORKS (May 2010 – Spring 2013)

Opening in Sainte-Barbe Library : May 10th, 2010

80'000 documents in open access 600'000 documents in stacks

Opening hours : 60h (Monday-Saturday, 10h-20h)


Shuttle system for document delivery between the different sites delay : 24h

REFURBISHING AND MOVING BACK

July 2010 – October 2012 : complete refurbishment

Normalization of evacuation system Normalization of protection against fire Complete changes in electric and plumbing systems Partial changes in ventilation systems Partial (80%) re-building of the stacks Refurbishment of new spaces and creation of 2 new reading rooms

September 2012 – March 2013 : moving back to Sorbonne

Spring 2013 : re-opening in Sorbonne

34 million € (including movings and new shelves)

BUILDING A NEW LIBRARY

Direct communication from and to ground floor in Sorbonne

Loss of storage in Sorbonne : 38%

2 new reading rooms

Free access : 60'000 documents / Open stacks : 400'000 documents

Specializations : history, philosophy, literature

New services to the users : « ask a librarian », scan on demand, personal researches in bibliography, bibliographic researches for researchers, etc.

New skills for the personal

NEW STACKS IN MARNE-LA-VALLEE

Initially (2006) :

consequence of Sorbonne library refurbishment program

Eventually (2014) :

common storage facility for university libraries, extension of CTLES' buildings in Marne-la-Vallée

108'000 m of storage

30 million €

2010 – 2013 : planning and building 2014 : opening
