






University of Helsinki in Brief

- Established in Turku 1640, moved to Helsinki in 1828
- 11 faculties
- 35,000 degree students
- 8,200 employees, including almost 4,000 researchers and teachers
- Operates on 4 campuses in Helsinki:
- City Centre Campus for Human Sciences
- Kumpula Science Campus
- Meilahti Campus for Medicine
- Viikki Campus for Life Sciences




Viikki Campus – A Dynamic Centre for Life Sciences

- Four faculties of the University of Helsinki:
 - Faculty of Agriculture and Forestry
 - Faculty of Pharmacy
 - Faculty of Veterinary Medicine
 - Faculty of Biological and Environmental Sciences
- Institute of Biotechnology
- Neuroscience Center
- 6,500 students and 1,600 teachers and researchers
- Research institutes
- Businesses
- Viikki is also a growing residential area emphasising ecological values and the natural surroundings.




Viikki Campus



Helsinki University Library

- The Helsinki University Library began operating as an independent institute of the University of Helsinki on 1 January 2010.
- The Library comprises Viikki Campus Library, City Centre Library, Kumpula Campus Library, Meilahti Campus Library Terkko and centralised services.
- Approximately 250 employees, annual budget of over €21 million.
- Finland's largest multidisciplinary university library
- The library is open to all, not only students and staff of the University and offers open access to the sources of scientific knowledge.
- The National Library of Finland is also an indipendent institute of the University of Helsinki.




Info Centre Korona - Key building in the heart of the Viikki Campus

- Architectural design: ARK-house Architects
- The building was completed in 1999
- Floor area 11,000 m²
- The info centre was named Korona after the double outer wall that surrounds the circular building.

The facade is like a shimmering corona of the sun

both day and night.





Info Centre Korona




- Two libraries

- The building has become a meeting point for the people.

- Viikki Library (a branch of Helsinki City Library)






Viikki Campus Library




- 250,000 local visits (year 2009)
- 800-1,200 daily users
- 180,000 loans and renewals
- 29 employees
- The space of the library is 5,000 m² in four floors
- 12,500 running metres of literature
- Electronic collection
- Rooms for group work (booking on the internet), computers, working spaces, study carrels, 24-h reading room




Viikki Library

- Viikki Library is one of the 35 branch libraries in Helsinki City Library
- In addition to ordinary city library services the special intrests are ecological matters and nature preservation.
- 190 500 local visits (year 2009)
- 281 500 loans (30 % children's books)



Library collaboration

- The customers have open access from one library to the other.
- Science has been brought closer to the residents of the city.
- The public library offers fiction for the students and researchers. Also text books!
- Joint premises: the reference book room and the reading room for journals – functional solutions
- Collection collaboration less nowadays (ecollection)
- Employee exchange



10 years period - Viikki Campus Library in Info Centre




- Good and largely used library services, collections and cosy working spaces especially for the students (learning centre)

Good collaboration with the City Library and the University









New challenges and partners Fit for what purpose?

- The new University Act (2010)
- Strategic Plan for the University 2010-2012
- The new Helsinki University Library
 - Strategic plan: library services for the researchers is one of the objectives.
 - Collection policy of the library: electronic collection
 - More research institutes will move to the Viikki campus: need for library services for the research institutes.



Fit for what purpose?

- Services for the research groups "Knot-project" last autumn in Viikki Campus Library
 - Prepare the way to a new partnership between research groups and the library
 - Model, test and evaluate the partnership between two research groups and the library
 - Services and service products to support the work of the researchers
 - Library space was not an issue.



Fit for what purpose?

- Learning centre and social aspects meeting point
- Redesigning: zoning, computer classrooms, information desk, working spaces of the employees of the Viikki Campus Library...
