In June 2022, after 2 years of online conferences, LIBER was finally able to have its first post-pandemic, in-person event. This marked a very special moment for our community. People were visibly delighted to see each other again face to face, highlighting that LIBER is a human network. It was made clear that we still enjoy the opportunities that inperson gatherings bring. During the pandemic period, we learned two important things we will certainly build on. The first one, is our capacity to adapt our organisation to exceptional circumstances. LIBER was able to maintain and even develop its activities in a very agile and convincing way. The second, maybe less obvious but quite crucial, is the strength of our network and community. This enabled people to keep working together despite the depressing and stressful times we were facing.

For many years, the key event for LIBER has been its Annual Conference. Since December 2022, the portfolio has been enriched by a Winter Event, which took place in Amsterdam. While the Annual Conference is a somewhat traditional event, the Winter Event is closer to an internal workshop. Active LIBER members from various working groups met and developed new ideas and partnerships from inside the community and shared their experience and views. At first, we were wondering if our members would attend in the numbers we expected. It quickly became evident that the Winter Event was a great success.

The past year has also seen the introduction of the new 2023-2027 Strategy. We discussed new directions and planned new actions. As it is a long-term process, the Strategy is in fact, an undergoing action that deeply involves not only the professional community but also the various and numerous partners of LIBER. The main priorities of the new strategy have been approved to deliver an ambitious and comprehensive vision of where research libraries should stand in 2027 and beyond. We envision our community as engaged and trusted hubs delivering state-of-the-art services and advancing open science for the benefit of both the research community and the public.

I invite you to discover the full portfolio of our activities. Enjoy the reading.

REFLECTIONS ON 2022-2023

Each year, we report on the main events and achievements from the past reporting period, starting from the date of the previous Meeting of Participants of LIBER.

How happy we were, last year, to gradually resume in-person networking again! Some events moved from online to actual locations, and other activities could finally start. Therefore, there was a lot of action for everyone in the LIBER community, including the LIBER Office. We tried to provide focus where needed, and experiment to maximise support for the LIBER network.

A very special moment this year for LIBER will be the change in the leadership of the LIBER Organisation. In May we said farewell to LIBER Director Astrid Verheusen. During her six years at LIBER, Astrid enhanced LIBER services and led many significant advancements in the organisation. The Executive Board will soon announce Astrid's successor.

Preparing for the LIBER Strategy 2023 - 2027

In 2023, we started implementing the new LIBER Strategy 2023 – 2027. Much of 2022 was dedicated to preparing the organisation of activities. Starting at the Annual Conference in Odense in October 2022, input was gathered from LIBER Participants and the Working Group members on what is needed to achieve our new goals. New Steering Committee Chairs and two co-chairs for the Task Force Rights & Values were appointed.

Summer and Winter Events

We are excited to report that we have had a wonderful inperson Annual Conference in Odense, Denmark in 2022. The LIBER community was finally able to meet after two years of online events. Everyone was so happy to meet again, and to dance after the Conference dinner! In addition, the long overdue and first-ever Winter Event was held in Amsterdam, The Netherlands. The Winter Event focused on bringing LIBER members, especially the Working Groups, closer together, and provided a more intimate atmosphere compared to the larger LIBER Annual Conference.

Finances

The hard work of the LIBER Office staff and strengthening of the LIBER Office's project administration paid off this year. Despite an anticipated loss due to the lingering impact of the COVID pandemic, we saw a positive financial result over 2022. This is a great achievement and remains important for securing the deliverance of services to the Participants of LIBER.

Proiects

We have continued to be successful in winning new project funding, mostly from the European Commission.

Ten projects are underway, three of which started this year: **DIAMAS**, **LibrarIN** and the **PALOMERA** project. LIBER Participants and the LIBER Office continue their involvement as much as possible in both new and ongoing projects.

LIBER Quarterly

Volume 33 no.1 was published in February 2023, and we are happy to report that Heli Kautonen started as Chair of the Editorial Board. Read more in the LIBER Quarterly Report within this publication.

Collaborations

In addition to the regular partnerships of LIBER, significant attention was given to collaboration within important networks, including UNESCO / La Referencia, SCOSS and the EOSC Foundation. Following up MoUs of 2021 with ADBU (France) and DFFU (Denmark), LIBER worked on collaborative studies. As much as possible, activities were taken up by Board Members.

The LIBER Office

Eight staff members work at the LIBER Office, under the leadership of the Executive Director. There has been a significant staff turnover in the last 12 months, including the role of LIBER Director. In May, we thanked Astrid Verheusen for her tremendous contribution to LIBER over the last 6 years of her directorship and started the process to fill this vacancy. For the period of May-September 2023, Martine Pronk will take the role of Interim Executive Director.

Executive Board Composition and Meetings

In Summer 2022, we thanked Jeannette Frey for 4 years of serving as LIBER's President and supporting the LIBER organisation so well during the difficult times of COVID pandemic. The Executive Board of 13 also welcomed three new members and three Board members were re-elected.

The Board met in person again in October 2022 in Uppsala (Sweden) and in Limassol (Cyprus) in February 2023. The Board discussed strategy, updates from the Working Groups and collaborations. Topics of special interest were how to secure the sustainability of the LIBER organisation and the EOSC membership of LIBER.

On 1 July 2021, the Dutch Management and Supervision of Legal Entities Act (WBTR) took effect. This law relates to the articles of association (or foundation statutes) of foundations such as LIBER and obliges LIBER to update some of their statutes' articles by notarial deed. The Board prepared the necessary changes for the Meeting of Participants to approve.

LIBER Quarterly (LQ) is the peer reviewed, open access journal of LIBER. LQ moved to openjournals.nl over a year ago and now we have the first full year of user statistics. There is a dramatic upward swing in the views and downloads of LQ papers (see table). We continue seeing benefits of the implementation of plugins for connecting DOIs, pushing content to the Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ) and an increased social media presence.

Performance

In 2022 we introduced the content category of practice paper. We are seeing an increase in uptake of this category for those submitting papers to the journal. It is particularly useful for papers derived from LIBER conference presentations. LQ published 10 papers in 2022:

- · Guest editorial (1)
- · Article (7)
- Review paper (1)
- · Practice paper (1)

All papers published in LQ in 2022 received two anonymous peer reviews, as per the LQ policy. A sincere thanks go to all professionals and academics who agreed to undertake peer reviews for LQ in 2022. As of February 2023, there have been 10 papers in review and 4 papers made ready for publication.

Developments

In 2022, the LQ editorial board agreed to establish another new paper category – data papers. A template will be developed and tested during the coming year. In recognition of the difficulty authors have in finding time to write their papers for publication, we agreed a trial programme of online 'Keep Calm and Write' sessions, hosted by LQ's Chair of the Editorial Board. The board also agreed to the proposal for exploring a special issue of LQ (in 2023) aligned with LIBER's strategic vision relating to upholding rights and values.

The LQ Managing Editor continues to work with the LIBER office to promote aligned communications activity and to develop the connection with LIBER's conference programming committee.



Editorial Board

The LQ editorial board got together for hybrid meetings in July and December 2022. Heli Kautonen was appointed as the new LIBER Quarterly Chair of Editorial Board. We are actively looking for board members, particularly those with expertise and interest in open data and the use of emerging technologies (like AI) in Libraries. We are also seeking additional support with editing activities.

During the 2022 Annual Conference in Odense, Giannis Tsakonas became the Vice-president of LIBER. He handed over the chairmanship of the Innovative Scholarly Communication Steering Committee to Dora Gaálné Kalydy, our newly elected Board member. The change took place online in August 2022. We are strengthening and expanding the roles of research libraries through our **Open Access, Copyright & Legal Matters, Educational Resources and Citizen Science** working groups.

Open Access

At the Annual Conference in Odense, they held two webinars: "Four Urgent Recommendations for Open Access Negotiations with Publishers" and Assessing, Financing and Maintaining Open Access infrastructure – a New Role for Libraries." In October, after attending the Open Access Week 2022, the LIBER OA group shared some OA insights and experiences to follow the latest developments towards the mainstreaming of fully OA publishing principles.

They further participated in the development of the <u>Think.</u> <u>Check.Submit teaching tool</u>. In October, after attending the Open Access Week 2022, the LIBER OA group shared some <u>OA insights</u> and experiences to follow the latest developments towards the mainstreaming of fully OA publishing principles.

Copyright & Legal matters

A Joint Statement was signed in July, on The Digital Services Act – Education and Science Require Better Policy Making Procedures. In August the European Commission issued a study entitled: Study on EU copyright and related rights and access to and reuse of scientific publications, including open access. The LIBER Secondary Publishing Right Model Law was referenced and evaluated. In October, the group released a Secondary Publishing Rights Position Paper together with the KR21 Programme.

Educational Resources

A workshop on "Sharing and Caring" was held by the Educational Resources Working Group at the 2022 LIBER Conference in Odense. A <u>new focus to work on open textbooks</u> was announced at the end of February 2023, as was a call for new members. Are you interested in joining the group? Please have a look at the <u>scope of the working group</u> and fill in the <u>membership form</u>. The group is preparing a workshop on "How can we enhance the discoverability of open textbooks? Handson workshop and discussion," is in preparation for the LIBER Annual Conference in Budapest.

Citizen Science

Two workshops were held at the UKSG 2022 (United Kingdom Serials Group) in May 2022. The CS Working Group held a workshop at the Annual Conference, "Open to Society" as well as organised a poster. In August, the group participated at Integrating Citizen Science at Universities at the INOS Project closing event – Fostering Change: Integrating Open and Citizen Science at HEIs at Leiden University Library. The group is involved in two ongoing projects: one of LIBER CEOS_SE Project, and another that LIBER is not officially part of, called LibOCS (University libraries strengthening the academia-society connection through citizen science in the Baltics).

A presentation was published in August on Zenodo by the group: Citizen Science Guides and Enhanced OA Publishing. The group also organised a workshop at the LIBER Winter Event to train the LIBER network on how to engage citizens in citizen science projects, producing a video in the process: Example of a movie for citizen science recruitment (a fictional research project).

International projects



ReCreating Europe - Rethinking Digital Copyright Law for a Culturally Diverse, Accessible, Creative Europe LIBER participated in the G.L.A.M. (galleries, libraries, archives, and museums,) activities of the project, and leads the Work Package on Dissemination, Engagement & Outreach, including training activities. The project had its final conference in March 2023, in Brussels. The Open Up Museums! Workshop in Trento, Italy focused specifically on copyright and access to digital culture in the GLAM sector, as demonstrated in the blog post, "Recap on the 'Open Up Museums!' Event — reCreating Europe Project". LIBER also created video tutorials, (together with project partners) tailored to each stakeholder group.

Open Research Europe Open Research Europe

ORE - Open Research Europe is an Open Access, peer-reviewed publishing platform for beneficiaries of Horizon 2020 funding. LIBER is a partner in the project and spearheads efforts to engage research libraries and other stakeholders who could benefit from the platform. Our activities include organising workshops, webinars and trainings for the platform. We ensure that all project news reaches the right audiences within the Open Access landscape in Europe. A representative of ORE hosted a session at the Winter Event 2022 and presented: How the Open Research Europe Publishing Model Promotes Community. A workshop, ORE Project Workshop on Sustainability — Plans for a Future-Proof and Robust Publishing Platform, was held earlier this year.



<u>CeOS_SE</u> - <u>Citizen-Enhanced Open Science in South-</u> <u>Eastern Europe Higher Education Knowledge Hubs</u>

The CeOS_SE project aims to raise awareness and mainstream Open Science (OS) and Citizen Science (CS) practices in Southeastern Europe. LIBER is the project coordinator and supports all project activities. All members of this project are LIBER members as well, solidifying our position, our dedication, as well as collaboration within the LIBER community. Watch a brief introduction of our involvement in the project from our LIBER office. Findings of the first two completed studies – Recommendations for academic and research libraries within Citizen-Enhanced Open Science and Upscaling collaboration between academic and public libraries for CeOS in SE Europe – were presented at the Winter Event 2022.



The KR21 - Knowledge Rights 21 programme aims to mobilise Europe's libraries to engage with others across the access to knowledge movement and build momentum towards long term copyright reform. LIBER managed the Communications Work Package of the project in Q4 of 2022. It is now leading the Secondary Publishing Rights Work Package of the KR21 Programme. To start, the team is conducting a study to understand the factors, incentives, obstacles and practices that helped to shape the legislative framework for Open Access in several European Countries. The project is called Project Zero.



DIAMAS - Developing Institutional Open Access

Publishing Models to Advance Scholarly Communication DIAMAS is developing a European Reference Standard in the domain of institutional publishing. It aims to improve the efficiency, quality, and good practices of publishing activities and services in the European Research Area (ERA) at all institutional levels. LIBER is responsible for the website, communications, engagement and other activities. In their workshop at the Winter Event 2022, the project members already presented <u>Understanding</u> Institutional Publishing (Slides on Zenodo).



LibrarIN - Value Co-Creation and Social Innovation fora New Generation of European Libraries

The LibrarIN Project is looking at ways that libraries can develop new functions, services and engagement with the individuals, organisations and communities they serve. As leaders of WP6 (Dissemination, Communication and Sustainability), LIBER heads the dissemination of project results and awarenessraising within the scientific and policy community, stakeholders in general, practitioners and citizens. LIBER will also use its network of research libraries and connections within the library community to contribute to mapping exercises and will play a decisive role in stakeholder engagement tasks. The project's latest participation was in the 32nd Conference of the European Association for REsearch on SERvices (RESER), in Paris, which took place in December 2022, about a month following the project's launch.

"Value co-creation is often defined as the involvement of citizens in the initiation and/or design of public services. However, we need to link co-creation to the value generated at the end of the production process too. The vision of LibrarIN is to discover, analyse and provide managerial and policy recommendations for transformative strategies that integrate the co-creation of value in public libraries through the introduction of a new paradigm of public service and social innovation.

INOS - Integrating Open and Citizen Science into Active Learning Approaches in Higher Education (concluded August 2022)

For the past three years, LIBER has participated in the Erasmus+ funded project INOS (Integrating Open and Citizen Science in Higher Education Learning Approaches). On 31st August 2022, INOS project partners joined together with local Open Education and Open Science advocates for the event Fostering Change: Challenges and Opportunities of Integrating Open and Citizen Science in Higher Education, held at Leiden University Library. The event was a final opportunity for the INOS project to share outputs and determine how these results will be sustained in future activities.

We are developing research libraries as hubs for digital skills and services in both physical and virtual environments, and contributing to this goal through our **Digital Scholarship and Digital Cultural Heritage Collections** and **Leadership Programmes** working groups.

Digital Scholarship and Digital Cultural Heritage Collections (Formerly Digital Cultural Heritage and Digital Humanities)

The Digital Scholarship and Digital Cultural Heritage Collections Working Group (DSDCH WG) developed a new workplan that was put in place in July. Their teams have been reorganised as such: Responsible use of digital collections (formerly Digital Collections) (led by Marian Lefferts and Rossitza Atanassova), Digital Competencies / Providing expertise (led by Caleb Derven and Lotte Wilms), Building Relationships (led by Liam O'Dwyer and Sarah Ames), Emerging theme: Digital impact (led by Nora McGregor). At the Annual Conference 2022, the DSDCH WG held a pre-conference workshop: Digital Scholarship Now! which presented a series of lightning talks showcasing some of the most innovative responses and/or provocations to the most pressing questions currently affecting the digital scholarship community today. At the Winter Event, the group held a workshop that introduced the idea of the group producing a Guidebook/ Online resource. As an outcome of the workshop, draft personas for the online resource prototype were created by LIBER members.

Leadership Programmes

The first Emerging Leaders (ELP) seminar – Cohort 6 – took place from 3 to 5 May 2022 at ENSSIB (École Nationale Supérieure des Sciences de l'Information et des Bibliothèques), Lyon. LIBER Journées 2022 followed in Budapest on May 18-20, 2022. A <u>promotional video</u> and a leadership programmes poster were also produced. A total of 13 participants took part in the programme. At the LIBER Annual Conference an Alumni workshop Leadership course took place, as well as a workshop on leadership in 'Positioning the library as a valued


partner in our universities in an open science world.' The final meeting for Cohort 5 took place on Tuesday 5 July 2022 at the University of Southern Denmark campus in Odense. The group held a Leadership Workshop at the LIBER Winter Event. The planning of the next LIBER Journées 2024 and ELP seminar, Cohort 6, are in the works. A brainstorming for Journées topics resulted in a tentive: "Trusted leadership and challenging times". The programme has a new chair: Anja Smit, as well as two new members.

International project



ELE - European Language Equality (concluded)
A core role of LIBER in the project has been the creation of a report which surveyed and interviewed our Participants on the imbalance between European languages in terms of the support they receive through Language Technologies (LTs). The project concluded in June 2022. A blog post was published following the project's round up.









We promote the development of interoperable and scalable infrastructure — which supports sustainable knowledge and is seamlessly linked with institutional services — through our Research Data Management, Federated Identity Management for Libraries, Linked Open Data, Data Science in Libraries and LIBER Architecture Group (LAG) working groups.

Research Data Management

In addition to publishing The FAIR Guidelines for Libraries, the RDM WG contributed a workshop to the LIBER conference, Data management cooperation in practice: Lesson learned. The group continues its work and planning activities, and new members are always welcome. The group organised a very successful workshop Data Management in Libraries at the 2022 LIBER Winter Event and aims to have another workshop at LIBER 2023. Members are planning to finalise and publish videos on different roles of library staff in data curation. RDM WG group has finalized its work on an updated guide to FAIR practices in research libraries. This includes action points on how to engage researchers with research data management and the FAIR data principles. The RDM WG is planning to produce and publish a factsheet: Basics on DMPs for librarians.

Federated Identity Management for Libraries (FIM4L)

The group held a series of conversations with Elsevier and summarized its views on challenges and opportunities related to federated access in a blog post entitled: FIM4L Working Group in Talks with Elsevier — Towards Federated Access Best Practices. The FIM4L WG published a second version of 10 Implementation Principles for single sign on (SSO), while collecting feedback from libraries and publishers. The group presented its work on federated authentication with SSO to UN libraries. At the Winter Event, they organized at workshop on "Understanding federated authentication to library e-resources".

Data Science In Libraries (DSLib)

The Data Science in Libraries (DSLib) Working Group had several focuses for the previous strategic period: <u>Data stewardship</u>, <u>Research data management</u>, <u>Semantic Interoperability and Open Linked Data</u>. To serve their goals, they sent out a <u>survey to map the presence of data science in research libraries</u>. The DSLib WG contributed a workshop during the Winter Event, on "Data Science in Libraries: Landscape Analysis & Survey II", a follow-up on the workshop held at LIBER 2022

LIBER Architecture Group (LAG)

The LIBER Architecture Group held a seminar in Luxembourg from 27-29 April 2022. A summary of the event was published by the LIBER Office and all presentations have been made available via Zenodo. An interactive workshop organised by the working group during the LIBER Winter Event 2022 produced a stream of ideas for architects designing libraries and how to categorise information in their database. The next LAG Seminar will be held in 2024 at the Royal Library of Belgium in Brussels

International projects



MES-CoBraD - The Multidisciplinary Expert System for the Assessment & Management of Complex Brain Disorders

The MES-CoBraD project seeks to improve early, accurate, and comprehensive diagnosis of CoBraD through the multisource-multidisciplinary MES-CoBraD Assessment Protocol. Furthermore, the project aims to engage citizen scientists throughout the project cycle and LIBER's network will help facilitate this objective. LIBER leads project activities related to stakeholder engagement activities and opportunity-based dissemination.

LIBER also participates and supports the development of legal and ethical frameworks, landscape analysis and methodology, RWD acquisition pilots, and awareness-raising, dissemination and communication. LIBER presented a poster on Data Management in the MES-CoBraD Project at the LIBER Annual Conference 2022. Several deliverables from the project are also available on Zenodo.



LIBER ANNUAL ACCOUNTS 2022

Accounts

LIBER's financial position has improved compared to 2021. The financial result for the Foundation for the year ending 31 December 2022 is a surplus of € 147.898,- (2021: a surplus of € 10.638,-). LIBER's capital and liquidity position is currently in order.

By 2022, the negative financial consequences due to the COVID-19 pandemic have been resolved. Overall, both income and expenses have increased, with significant growth in income from projects. This is due to both a growth in the number of projects, and a catch-up in billable work for already ongoing projects following the end of the COVID-19 crisis. This has resulted in a (expected one-off) significant profit in 2022.

Even though the 2022 result is positive, the LIBER organisation depends heavily on temporary project income. It is therefore necessary to increase LIBER reserves to ensure future sustainability. To further strengthen the foundation and face financial challenges with confidence, the positive result from 2022 is partly allocated to appropriated reserves (€ 75.000,-) and partly to general reserves (€ 72.898,-).

Solvency remained roughly the same at 55% in 2022 compared to 57% in 2021 (equity as a percentage of the balance sheet in total).
