

Annual Conference Survey 2016

I Key Findings

Thank you to the 200+ people who participated in our 2016 conference survey (45% of the 531 delegates gave feedback). The main findings of the survey are listed below and will be used to improve the 2017 Annual Conference in Patras, Greece.

The Helsinki conference was the most highly ranked LIBER conference of recent times, scoring an overall Approval Rating of 93.5%. Parallel Sessions were rated as 'good' or 'very good' by 88% of attendees.

The highest ranking keynote speech 'Digital Humanities In and Of the Library' was given by Dr Peter Leonard of Yale University. The recording is available on the conference website¹.

In addition to enjoying the overall programme, delegates commented favourably on the quality of the catering and the many helpful volunteers at the Helsinki conference.
