Activities SC & Working Groups:

On the 22nd of June the SC had a virtual meeting.

Close to the conference the Working Group on Innovative Metrics released the report "Why Do Measures Fluctuate? Metrics Report - Guidelines for Talking to Management", which has 445 downloads so far. After the end of the LIBER2020 Online Conference the Working Group on Innovative Metrics was disbanded. The Group prepared a final report, which is attached as an Annex to this report. Please note that there must be a correction in the report by mentioning that the first period was co-chaired by Sarah Coombs (together with Isabella Peters).

The WG on Copyright and Legal Matters suggested to co-sign with IFLA, EBLIDA, NAPLES, SPARC and PL2030 the letter "Libraries all over Europe are calling for a reinforcement of the European cultural and educational dimension". In general, the WG was active in the area of highlighting the inequalities and the obstacles that the coronavirus pandemic imposed in the e-book market.

The Chairs of Open Access and Citizen Science Working Groups participate in the panel <u>"Open Science and the Management of a Cultural Change"</u> of the session Academic & Scholarly of the digital version of the International Book Fair of Frankfurt.

Overall progress (Provide an overview of activities and products delivered since the previous report and the planning of upcoming activities and products)

Activities SC & Working Groups:

The working group on Linked Data published the report summarizing the results of their survey on library linked data publishing (https://zenodo.org/record/3647844). The WG presented its results at a workshop on "LOD Publication for Libraries" at LIBER2020 (https://doi.org/10.5281/zenodo.3904123). The workshop combined presentations showcasing various aspects of library linked open data with a review of an advanced draft version of a set of best practices for releasing linked open library data. Based on the discussion in the workshop, a final version will be released in autumn 2020.

The RDM WG continues its activities through its task groups on e.g. data stewardship, data curation, the DMP Catalogue, FAIR data and engaging researchers. The WG presented recent results and facilitated a discussion on "Hot Research Data Management Topics" through a workshop at the LIBER2020 conference (https://doi.org/10.5281/zenodo.3928087), and collected feedback on ongoing work (e.g. guidance on engaging researchers).

The Federated Identity Management working group (FIM4L, https://libereurope.eu/strategy/research-infrastructures/fim4l/) published guidelines and recommendations for federated identity management for public comments. The consolidated results were presented and discussed in a presentation at the session "Securing and building trust" at LIBER2020 (https://doi.org/10.5281/zenodo.3921751). The official publication of the recommendations is in preparation.

The LIBER Architecture Group has successfully relaunched the "Library Buildings in Europe" website (https://www.librarybuildings.eu/), which was promoted by a blog post (https://libereurope.eu/bloq/2020/06/22/just-launched-library-buildings-in-europe-website/) and social media postings during the Liber conference week.

A new WG on applications of Data Science in libraries was discussed at the





	LIBER Board at the February 2020 meeting; the process of founding the group was postponed due to the Covid-19 pandemic, next steps for opening a call for expressions of interest will be discussed at the Oct 2020 EB meeting.
