

LIBER JOURNÉES 2020: STRATEGIC VISION

*Library and Information Centre Hungarian Academy of Sciences, Budapest
Wednesday 13th May – Friday 15th May 2020*

The LIBER Journées will bring 20–25 library directors together with eminent global speakers for a stimulating, interactive and strategic programme, addressing major challenges that face us all. The underpinning theme will be “Leading Libraries in the World of Openness”. The focus will be on the role of the Director in leading library services and provision in rapidly changing digital, research and educational environments and within a developing trend towards shared – and even outsourced – services.

1 Strategic Issues & Opportunities

At the heart of the LIBER Journées will be strategic issues and opportunities that challenge and motivate us all. For instance:

- What does openness mean for the library and how can we lead our libraries in the world of openness?
- What is the role of a library and its leaders in a shifting world of instant information, changing scholarly communication, big data digital content and openness?
- What is the library’s role in an increasingly digital shared services environment?
- What value does the library bring to people when dealing with information in the future, for instance, academics, students, journalists, entrepreneurs, citizens?
- How do we manage the image shift between traditional perceptions of libraries and librarians and their leading role with access to open, reliable and high-quality information in the future?
- What are the libraries stakeholders and decision makers scope of expectations? How is the librarian’s voice heard at a time when libraries may not be present at the top table?
- How do we strengthen networks and dialogue with academic decision makers, researchers and educators?
- Is it all about demonstrating values and advocacy or more about political nous, business acumen, thought leadership and sitting at the top table?
- How can we take advantage of trends in innovation (e.g. artificial intelligence) and inspiration to embed libraries more effectively in academic projects and transformations in order to deliver a better information service for the benefit of all?
- How do library leaders participate in shaping and modelling the future of academic research and education through developing high quality and open information services?

2 Chair & Facilitators

Norbert Lossau, Vice President of the Georg-August-Universität Göttingen, will act as Chair of the LIBER Journées, ensuring cohesion, interaction and participation throughout the three days. Facilitators will also contribute to the smooth running of the seminar.

3 Speakers

The Journées will be divided into eight sessions led by eminent speakers from the information, library, cultural or business world, from Europe and beyond. Each speaker will focus on specific strategic questions, relating their presentations to the library environment and key challenges. Presentations will be followed by facilitated debate, discussion and analysis. Break-out sessions will focus on issues which participating Directors have flagged up in advance of the LIBER Journées, and will synthesise the outcomes of the sessions and the strategic questions addressed.
