Overall progress (Provide an overview of activities and products delivered since the previous report and the planning of upcoming activities and products)

Activities SC & Working Groups:

The SC held a meeting in the reporting period and all the WGs had their regular meetings as well. As usual, the summer months have not been very active, but provide a chance to regroup, review and plan the forthcoming period.

The WG of Copyright and Legal Matters concentrated its efforts in the launching of the KnowledgeRights21 project, which is funded by the Arcadia Foundation. As mentioned in previous reports, the project will focus on eBooks, open access (#zeroembargo campaign and right retention), the undermining of copyright exceptions by licenses and technologies and an open flexible norm in Europe (see more at https://libereurope.eu/article/press-release-knowledge-rights-21-21st-century-access-to-culture-learning-and-research-in-europe/). The project launch was postponed in July and officially started in late September. It is expected that it will host some activities of the ZeroEmbargo campaign (Secondary Publisher Right), which is inactive the last couple of months. The WG supported the eBook SOS campaign by suggesting sending letters to the Chairs of Competition and Markets Authority urging that a market investigation is undertaken. A carbon

copy to the EU Directorate General on Competition was also sent. Finally, the WG raised the issue that LIBER should pile some pressure to allow WikiMedia Foundation to have the Observer Status in WIPO (blocked by China). The WG of Citizen Science started the negotiation for partnership with two key partners, namely ECSA and SciStarter, and has prepared the respective Memoranda of Understanding, which have been submitted to the Executive Board for review and consideration for approval. The WG was presented at the Croatian Special Libraries Association Annual Conference (Oct 2nd, 2021) and continues to prepare "The Research Librarians Guide to Citizen Science" and the BESPOC templates. The WG submitted one proposal for workshop in the Winter Event. The new WG on Educational Resources has been set up and has met already two times. The WG has started planning its activities and the deliverables it wants to produce and has submitted two proposals for workshops in the Winter Event. One of these is with the Open Access WG on the digital accessibility of research publications and educational assets and aims to highlight the need to make these open for all, including the print-disabled users. No progress has been recorded on the Innovative Peer Review WG. The Chair of the Steering Committee has advertised it at the recent Open Science Fair 2021 workshop "Innovative Peer Review for Research Libraries" and was invited to write a Guest Editorial on the topic of Open Peer Review in the forthcoming issue of LIBER Quarterly. The WG on Open Access has resumed work on the revision of the "Five Principles for Negotiations with Publishers" and on the Think.Check.Submit initiative. The Group submitted two proposals for workshops in the Winter Event (one with the WG on Educational Resources). The Chair of the Steering Committee represented LIBER in the COAR strategic meeting about Future Repositories, as well as to the 10th UNICA Scholarly Communication online Seminar "Academic Libraries. Overall progress (Provide an overview of activities and products delivered since the previous report and the planning of upcoming activities and products) The RDM WG continues but has not resumed it activities since the summer Activities SC & Working Groups: break yet. The WG contributed a workshop "FAIR data enabling through European research libraries" where recent results of the working group and current activities and projects around data stewardship, a FAIR adoption handbook (FAIRsFAIR), journals' data (https://pad.gwdg.de/RDM_workshop_LIBER2021#). policies were presented Federated Identity Management working aroup https://libereurope.eu/strategy/research-infrastructures/fim4l/) meets on a bi-weekly basis. It currently plans its second consultation based on a revised version of its "Federated Access to Online Resources: Principles & Recommendations for Library Services". The WG delivered a webinar for the UKSG and contributed a presentation to the IFLA WC. The LIBER Architecture Group continues its work. For 2021 the WG has announced the LAG conference that will take place in Luxembourg from 27-29 April 2022. In addition, a webinar is planned for 2021. The Data Science in Libraries WG (DSLib) has set up its work space and meets regularly. It has identified three main areas of interest: creating a landscape analysis/overview, team/service building, funding opportunities, and will shape up a work plan in the next meeting. On 27 September 2021 members of the DSLib WG contributed to a workshop on AI/ML in Libraries, organised by Heli Kautonen and Andrea Gasparini which gathered feedback and additional input on current strategies and activities in libraries.
