#### **Project Highlights**

- European Language Equality (ELE) project finished in June 2022 with Brussels: META Forum 2022 (ELE Project Final Conference). LIBER, in the context of the ELE project, delivered the final report on LIBER activites in the project.
- Integrating Open & Citizen Science Into Active Learning Approaches in Higher Education (INOS) project finished its activities in August with the project's final multiplier event 'Fostering Change: Challenges and Opportunities for Integrating Open and Citizen Science in Higher Education. The final multiplier event was hosted on the premises of the Leiden University Library, where project partners met with local academic and library staff, members of OS/CS networks and projects, and other stakeholders to discuss, debate, and celebrate the work INOS project. The INOS project, which successfully mainstreamed Osintegrated HE curricula, ended on 31 August.
- CeOS\_SE Project Citizen-Enhanced Open Science in Southeastern Europe Higher Education Knowledge Hubs. Project members met between 19-23 September for the first time in person at the upcoming Transnational Project meeting and LTTA (Learning, Teaching, and Training Activity) in Zagreb, Croatia. The transnational project meeting highlited the results of the completed work and set the plan of actions for the future project acitivites. Furthermore, the LTTA addressed obstacles in fully meeting open and





citizen science cycle as well as meeting large discrepancies in countries' needs. Especially in SE Europe, partners vividly expressed the need for upskilling in CS.

- The Horizon Europe project "Developing Institutional Open Access Publishing Models to Advance Scholarly Communication (DIAMAS) started on the 1st of September 2022. The DIAMAS project partners and members of the Diamond Open Access Plan Community had the chance to meet and discuss collaboration opportunities during the Diamond Open Access Conference (Zadar, Croatia, 19 20 September 2022). LIBER, together with partners from OPERAS, EIFL, and Sparc Europe, successfully presented the plans for implementation of WP7 "The Road to Impact: Outreach, Disemmination and engagement exploatation". Moreover, LIBER also presented logos for the project and a new DIAMAS website: www.diamasproject.eu
- LIBER hosted a public webinar on' Managing complex chronic conditions using real-world data in the context of The Multidisciplinary Expert System for the Assessment & Management of Complex Brain Disorders (MES-CoBraD). The webinar focused on how research on RWD can provide improved care through the MES-CoBraD, RETENTION, and Re-SAMPLE projects'. In addition, the webinar looked closely at how the project takes a data-intensive approach to improving medical outcomes.
- LIBER, in the context of the ORE (Open Research Europe project ) compiled 13 Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) about the Open Research Europe (ORE) publishing Platform, geared toward research librarians and researchers. The FAQs were designed to help them better understand ORE and the peer-review process and to encourage its uptake in research libraries.
- The project proposal on HORIZON-WIDERA-2022-ERA-01-42-PALOMERA was approved in August 2022. The GA is in the phase of preparation. The project aims to speed up the transition to open access for books. The project will start on the 1st of January 2023.
- Value Co-Creation and Social Innovation for a New Generation of European Libraries-LibarIN was approved in February 2022. The preparation for conducting the Grant and Consortium Agreement was accomplished by the end of September. The LibrarIN is a research project that provides new avenues for participatory management and sustainable finance for European libraries. The project will start on 1 November 2022. The Kick-Off meeting is foreseen on 10-11 November in Athens, Greece.
