#### **Activities SC & Working Groups:**

As during the Odense 2022 Annual Conference Giannis Tsakonas became the Vice-president of LIBER, he handled the chairmanship over to Dora Gaálné Kalydy newly elected Board member. The takeover took place online in August 2022.

Since August 2022 the SC did not have a meeting, it is scheduled between 24-26 October 2022 after the Board meeting.

The SC Working Group hold a workshop at the Annual Conference with the title "Open to Society". During the past months WG members organised several activities promoting the libraries' active role in CS projects (Citizen Science Conference in Sárospatak, Hungary 03. 04. 2022, Österreichische Citizen Science Konferenz, Dornbirn, 28.-30.06.2022, PubMed, Zadar, Croatia 14-16. 09. 2022.) The Section 2., 3., 4 if the Guide is under development. (Section 2: Library Infrastructures & Citizen Science; Section 3.: Good (Open Science) Practices & Citizen Science; Section 4: Citizen Science Programme Development.

The WG is going to deliver a workshop at the Winter Event.

The Open Access Working Group also hold a workshop at Odense: Assessing, Financing and Maintaining Open Access Infrastructures – a New Role for Libraries.

The WG is strongly monitoring the OA trends of Europe, how





diamond OA could take over form gold OA.

Online conferences involving the WG members are going to be organised during the Autumn period.

The WG is going to deliver a workshop at the Winter Event.

The Copyright & Legal Matters Working Group have focussed primarily on monitoring and discussing developments in Europe regarding intellectual property and digital platform developments. In addition to national updates, we have also discussed and monitored progress of Knowledge Rights 21 which is sponsored by the Arcadia Foundation and coordinated by LIBER, IFLA and SPARC Europe.

The WG issued a public statement saying that we believe that never in commerce works should not be subject to remuneration from collective management organisations under the new Copyright in the Single Market Directive. This led to an invitation to speak at a Europeana meeting with European cultural heritage organisations and the Federation of European Publishers / CMOs. In addition to this, we also worked with Science Europe, European Universities Association et cetera on the Digital Services Act issuing a number of statements. In August the European Commssion issued a study entitled: Study on EU copyright and related rights and access to and reuse of scientific publications, including open access.

Exceptions and limitations, rights retention strategies and the secondary publication right. We were delighted to see that the LIBER Secondary Publishing Right Model law was referenced and evaluated.
